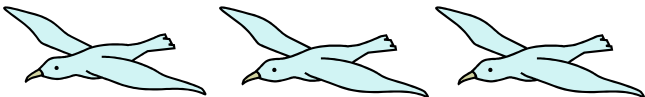
## What should my child bring?
